The world famous literary works, Bard of Avon has for decades inspired the Indian Cinema. Adapting Shakespeare's work to Indian ethos is the latest thing in Indian cinema. Shakespeare plays have become synonymous with Indian cinema over the years.

Widely the paper discusses about two area. Firstly in what ways Vishal Bharadwaj has memorized the flavors of Shakespeare and secondly

in what way he changed as we have noticed that Othello became Omkara, Macbeth became Maqbool and Hamlet became Haider.

Maqbool- Miyal Maqbool- Macbeth; Nimmi- Lady, Macbeth; Jahangir Khan (Abbaji)-Duncan of Scotland; inspector pandit- witch (weird sisters); inspector purohit- (weird sisters) kakabanquo; riyaz boti- Macduff; Guddu- felance; sameera- abbaji's daughter (Malcolm) riyaz boti's wife- Lady Macduff; riyaz boti's son Macduff's son. Mughal-macdonwald; Asif- Cawdor. It is a classical tale of greed and ambition is transplanted to Mumbai's criminal (Irrfan khan) underworld.

The film Maqbool was released in Hindi language in 2003 and is directed by Vishal Bharadwaj's. The film is based on the story of Macbeth from the Shakespeare's play. The film explores multiple dimensions of the close connection and personal in debtedness.

Maqbool (Irrfan Khan) is the right hand of Jahangir Khan (alias Abbaji) a powerful underworld don. The movie obtains speed with two corrupt and personal police men (played by Om Puri and Nasserudin Shah). Anticipating that Maqbool wants to become Mumbai underworld don.

Nimmi (Tabu) is a mistress of Jahangir Khan (Abbaji) but she secretly loves Maqbool and

Maqbool loves Nimmi too. Nimmi also uplift Maqbool ambitions and convince him to kill Abbaji in order to take over as don. Maqbool is confused between his love for Nimmi and his loyalty to Abbaji. At last he decides to kill Abbaji in cold blood while he is in bed at night, with Nimmi next to him.

Just as planned Maqbool takes over as don. But Nimmi and Maqbool haunted by guilt, seeing Abbaji ghost they unable to wash the blood from their hands. So the murder of Jahangir Khan (Abbaji) evokes pity in us as they are also delightful human being. The movie also adopts Banquo's son who is very young in the movie. King Duncan son is replaced by Sameer a woman.

The twist in the movie is the love angle between Guddu and Sameera. During the wedding ceremony of Guddu and Sameera Jahangir starts paying attention to another woman who is a dancer. Nimmi turns malicious provoking Maqbool into killing Jahangir Khan. So, the murder of Jahangir Khan is not just vested in spiritual predictions alone in the movie. It is also driven by his human flaws.

Another major adaptation Bharadwaj does is to have two ageing police officers instead of the witches. They are also called Pandit Purohit. (Om Puri and Nasserudin Shah), which are mystic as well as popular surname in India. At last, Nimmi dies after giving birth to a baby boy. This boy is left in the hospital temporarily as Maqbool and Nimmi flee the hunt initiated by Guddu against them. The drama has an intense fight between Macduff and Macbeth ending in Macbeth's death. Guddu and Sameera visit the hospital and plan to adopt the child becomes the reason for Maqbool to give up the fight. Maqbool son now becomes the heir apparent to Guddu's empire.

Omkara is a 2006 Indian crime drama adapted from Shakespeare's play Othello, co-written

and directed by Vishal Bharadwaj. The characters in Bharadwaj's movie share the same first letters as their counter parts in the Shakespearean play. The movie Omkara can be said to be on the global theme suspicion kills. Vishal had liberally borrowed themes from Hindu epics- such as Ramayana and Mahabharata (politics of power) rather than Othello. The movie set in the rural area of the North Indian state of Uttar Pradesh. Omkara of Omi (Ajay Devgan) is a political goon in love with Dolly (Kareena Kapoor) a lawyer's daughter. Omkara has two trusted right hand men namely Ishwar "Langda" Tyagi (Saif Ali Khan) and Kesu (Vivek Oberoi). Ishwar is a sharpshooter- smart he is married to Indu (Konkana Sen), Kesu is an educated and loyal whose mistress is a local dancer named Billo (Bipasha Basu).

Omkara (Othello) chooses) Kesu chief Lieutenant over Langda. This single incident sets off Langda to bring down Omkara (Othello) and Kesu by showing suspicious in Omkara of Dolly and Kesu having an affair. Langda teams up with Rajoh, who is revengeful over Dolly's refusal to marry him, and they create circumstantial evidence that makes Othello began to suspect Dolly.

At last, the death of the Desdemona or Dolly in the Indian context is identical making a statement of the inhumanity of perceiving and treating a woman which is still prevalent in the patriarchal society way back in the 15th c of Shakespeare or the Modern times of 21st c.

After his father disappearance, in order to search for him, Haider leaves his studies and comes back to Kashmir. It was the time when in urgency was at height, his father, who was a doctor by profession was found guilty of helping militants was carried away by the armed forces. He is disappointed and dejected to finds his mother in an illegal relationship with his uncle, whom he later discovered to be a traitor and responsible for his father ill-fate.
